## 【Event Announcement】

### I. Purpose

To enhance students' international academic competitiveness and strengthen their abilities in academic English communication, problem identification, and research strategy development.

### II. Date and Venue

#### 1. Date

- **Day 1:** Thursday, May 28, 2026, 1:10 PM – 8:30 PM (Ph.D. Group)
- **Day 2:** Friday, May 29, 2026, 1:10 PM – 9:30 PM  
(Master's Group in the afternoon; Pre-graduate Group in the evening)
- The detailed competition schedule and presentation time for each group will be announced 5 days before the event. Participants who fail to check in at the designated time will be regarded as absent and disqualified.

### III. Eligibility

1. Eligible participants include current undergraduate students, pre-graduate students, master's students, and Ph.D. students affiliated with the College of Medicine. All departments and programs of the College of Medicine, include:

  - Department of Respiratory Therapy
  - Department of Sports Medicine
  - Graduate Institute of Medicine
  - Graduate Institute of Clinical Medicine
  - Master's Program, Department of Sports Medicine
  - Master of Science Program in Tropical Medicine
  - Ph.D. Program in Translational Medicine
  - Ph.D. Program in Environmental and Occupational Medicine
  - Doctoral Degree Program in Biomedical Engineering
2. Pre-graduate students:

Eligibility is primarily based on the official admission lists announced by the Office of Academic Affairs. Students who have applied for the pre-graduate student program of any graduate program within the College of Medicine for Academic Year 114 and whose application status has been confirmed by the organizing committee are also eligible to participate.

3. Graduate students of all nationalities, including international students and working/part-time students, are welcome to register.
4. The organizing committee reserves the right to adjust the competition schedule and presentation time slots according to the actual number of participants in each group.

<b>Undergraduate and Pre-graduate Student</b>	<b>Scientific observation, preliminary ideas, and science communication</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Suggested Content: Focus on identifying an interesting or important biomedical-related phenomenon or issue.</li> <li>• Preparation Focus: English fluency, creativity in presentation design (PPT), and the ability to explain complex concepts clearly and simply.</li> </ul>	5-minute Presentation + 2-minute Q&A
<b>Master's Student</b>	<b>Analysis and interpretation of biomedical literature</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Suggested Content: Select an important biomedical research paper, preferably published in a Q1 journal within the past 5 years. The presentation should focus on:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Core Question: What biomedical problem does this study address?</li> <li>• Key Mechanism/Strategy: What is the most important experimental design or mechanism?</li> <li>• Take-home Message: What contribution or insight does this study provide?</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Preparation Focus: Academic English usage, information organization, and concise summarization skills.</li> </ul>	6-minute Presentation + 2-minute Q&A
<b>Ph.D. Student</b>	<b>Innovative research strategies and logical framework development</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Suggested Content: Present a self-designed research topic focusing on innovative research strategies. Participants should analyze limitations in existing studies and propose an original research strategy or theoretical framework with logical justification.</li> <li>• Preparation Focus: Critical thinking, academic insight, and advanced academic English presentation skills.</li> </ul>	8-minute Presentation + 2-minute Q&A

**Note:** All presentation materials submitted by participants will be used solely for this competition and will not be used for any other purposes.
